There's a double bill of pianists at this weeklong contemporary-music festival on Saturday evening, with José Menor playing the music of Hèctor Parra at 7 p.m., including the composer's Piano Sonata and "Cinq Études d'Art," and Imri Talgam appearing at 8:30 p.m., with works by Conlon Nancarrow, Enno Poppe, Matthias Krüger and Yair Klartag.







On the occasion of the Further Complications Festival at the SPECTRUM experimental space located in Brooklyn (NYC), Alix Tucou, bass trombonist and composer of French origin, presented his solo album realized thanks to a Crowdfunding campaign started in Brooklyn last April . Work born from an interesting artistic collaboration with the sound engineer Rebekah Wineman who took care of the whole part related to the final mix of the songs.

The Giuseppe Veniero Project Contemporary Art Gallery in Palermo hosts the solo show by Maurizio Pometti (Catania 1987): an exhibition of oil works, watercolors, drawings and a work created for the artist's residence in Palermo are set up by April 13th to May 13th.

The exhibition entitled "Sleeping with the fans" is by Carla Ricevuto: the entire route is supported by a **sound installation** created by the French musician Alix Tucou, who will accompany the user in this visual-auditory experience.

"Sleep with the fanstasmas" for Pometti, is a slow, gestural dialogue - uncovered - with the fear of loss: through the medium of drawing and painting he retraces parts of the personal experience and scenarios of the life of his family as if it were a continuous present.

Re-elaborates figures, moments and memories assembles them as small fragments of a puzzle that is more composed, the more you find pieces thought to be lost but which, simply, were placed on the bottom of the box.

Reconstructing a memory becomes an antidote that helps to alleviate suffering (in this case in the future) because it allows you to share your bed, almost with resignation, with the torment of the unconscious.

Memories recounted as dreams, the same consistency and the same nuances: because memories almost never present themselves in a clear and limpid way, on them lies a veil - a shroud - which alters light and colors. Pometti's entire work reveals itself as a mixture of delicacy and torment, in memory of what has been and what will be.



Alix Tucou (Perigueux, 1981)

After graduating from the Conservatory of Bordeaux he spent the next 15 years playing in more than twenty countries and four continents as Bass Trombonist taking part in concerts with different musical styles (classical, contemporary, electronic, street art performance, metal, reggae, funk, world music, jazz and progressive music). In 2014 he moved to Montreal, Canada, where he received his Master's Degree in Classical Orchestra Performance with full marks under the direction of Professor David Russel Martin, professor of Orchestra Repertoire. Here he develops his skills as an orchestra musician, improvisation and jazz music. In 2015 he moves to New York where he will achieve the Post-Master's degree as Solo Performance, under the direction of the famous trombonist Achilles Liarmakopoulos (Canadian Brass).

In the Big Apple she has the opportunity to develop and deepen her personal project Technology and Bones, based on compositions of sound landscapes that relate, through improvisation times, with her low trombone.

Technology and Bones is an international project. In parallel he increased his career as a freelance musician working with big names in music such as: Vince Giordano, Fred Thomas from the JB's, John Cale, Steve Hackman, Evan Ziporyn, Ursulla Opens, Tyrone Cox, Daptone Records, EXO Orchestra, Wordless Orchestra, Terence Malik, Arturo O'Farrill, Bill Irwyn, Capezio Center Dance School and Pat Caterson.

From 2015 to the present he is also involved in transcriptions and arrangements of twenties and thirties jazz songs at Vince Giordano and the Nighthawks.



With interactions between a mixed track of endangered (or disappearing sounds from the industrial society) and Bass-Trombone improvisation this project asks questions about the evolution of humanity and its perception of the world .

Does human being will disappear with this fading technology and knowledge?

Ricostruire un ricordo diventa un antidoto che aiuta ad alleviare la sofferenza (futura in questo caso) perché permette di condividere il proprio letto, quasi con rassegnazione, con il tormento dell'inconscio.

Memorie raccontate come sogni, stessa consistenza e stesse sfumature: perché i ricordi non si presentano quasi mai in modo chiaro e limpido, su di essi si adagia, un velo – sudario – che ne altera luce e colori. L'intera opera di Pometti si rivela come un composto di delicatezza e tormento, in memoria di quello che è stato e di ciò che sarà.

Trapani, Alix Tucou and his project "Technology and Bones" at the San Rocco Museum



On April 6, at 6.30 pm, at the Museum of Contemporary Art Oratorio San Rocco Alix Tucou , Bass Trombonist and internationally renowned French composer, will present his solo album "Technology and Bones".

The project has already been presented, for the first time, on the occasion of the Further Complications Festival at the experimental SPECTRUM space in Brooklyn (NYC): a space that has hosted numerous and renowned names from Europe, North America and South America. Recently the artist performed in Sicily at the Convento del Carmine in Marsala and at the Contemporary Art Gallery Giuseppe Veniero Project in Palermo, during the Live Painting by the Catania artist Maurizio Pometti.

The event that will take place on the second floor - Salone dell'Abbraccio - of the San Rocco Museum, in full renovation, was born thanks to the collaboration of the director Liborio Palmeri with the Amici della Musica of Trapani. The concept of all of Tucou's work is based on a reflection linked to the relationship that exists between humanity and technology and how it can influence the perception of a human being about the environment that

surrounds it.

This is why all the tracks presented by the artist have a continuous relationship with sounds and technologies coming from different environments that dialogue, according to improvisation times, with an analogical instrument (in this specific case the basstrombone) which, unlike the sounds mechanical and technological, it creates a melody through the human breath. From here, in fact, the title Technology and Bones. Moreover, Liborio Palmeri proposed the performance of Tucou because the current atmosphere of the San Rocco is well linked with the content of the project presented by the artist.

The songs are real paintings of the subjective aesthetic imagery, surreal sounds and mixes that transport the user to places that include Magritian memories. Melodies that leave room for the most unconscious sensations, sounds that bring out that part that very often we leave dormant: that part that we left on the pillow of our childhood, forgetting how exciting it was to erase the ceiling of our house to be able to see a universe not exclusively made of stars and planets. Technology and Bones is a hymn to the imagination, even for those who have never found an expression medium, because for Alix Tucou the mind can become our best artistic container.
